In recognition of 400 years since Shakespeare's birth and the start of the Cambridge Shakespeare Festival are pleased to welcome author Andrew Muir

Born in Cowdenbeath, Fife, Scotland in 1958, Andrew grew up near Glasgow. He graduated from university, at twenty, after a four year Honours course. The final two years were spent solely reading literature, with Shakespeare a full paper in his own right. Inevitably, Shakespeare's work has remained an abiding interest ever since. Shakespeare in Cambridge is his fourth book and he also been an editor, scripted and appeared in DVD documentaries, and composed liner notes for CD releases.

In the Eighties he lived in Italy and Finland before getting married and then moving to London in 1986. After twelve years there he relocated to Cambridge and fell in love with the City and its Shakespeare Festival.
